Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) - 28th June, 2020

1st Reading – 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16A

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there."

Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight. Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

Responsorial Psalm – Psalms 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19

R. For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

The promises of the LORD I will sing forever, through all generations my mouth shall proclaim your faithfulness. For you have said, "My kindness is established forever;" in heaven you have confirmed your faithfulness. (R)

Blessed the people who know the joyful shout; in the light of your countenance, O LORD, they walk. At your name they rejoice all the day, and through your justice they are exalted. (R)

You are the splendour of their strength, and by your favour our horn is exalted. For to the LORD belongs our shield, and the Holy One of Israel, our king. For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord. (R)

2nd Reading – Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

Alleluia – 1 Peter 2:9

Alleluia, alleluia. You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation; announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. **Alleluia**

Gospel – Matthew 10:37-42

Jesus said to his apostles: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me.

Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me.

Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward.

And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward.

Covid 19 Social Restriction Guidelines for worship as at 24th May 2020

As you will be aware, restrictions have been re-imposed as of last weekend—after the printing of newsletter.

If you would like to come to Mass on any day it is important that you reserve a place. You can do by calling the Presbytery the day before your attendance between 10.30 am and 1.30 pm. Please be aware that we are limited to twenty members of the congregation for every Mass.

When you arrive at Church, you will be asked to sign a sheet giving just your first name and a contact phone number. These will be kept in the Presbytery for Twenty Eight days and then destroyed.

The four square metre rule, which limits the number of people who can be in a building applies at all times. This is not about distancing between people (which is 1.5 metres but is about building capacity).

When you arrive at Church there will be hand sanitiser available and it would be appreciated by all in our communities for those attending Mass that you might use it. Please also be aware that all hard service are sanitised at the conclusion of Mass. Your co-operation in this process would be much appreciated by indicating that a pew has been sat on by leaving the kneeler in front of that pew down.

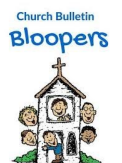
