# 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - 8th November 2020

# 1st Reading - A reading from the book of Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim. By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates. Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you. She herself walks about looking for those who are worthy of her and graciously shows herself to them as they go, in every thought of theirs coming to meet them.

# R. My soul is thirsting for you O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. **R.**

### 2nd Reading - A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians 4:13-18

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

# Gospel - A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten brides-maids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.

Excerpt of letter from Annie Carrett, Chancellor of the Archdiocese, Chief of Staff to the Archbishop Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

### Together in mission and hope'

Earlier this year, the Archdiocese began a review of our overall online presence with a view to improving the Archdiocesan, agency and parish websites. Prior to COVID-19, and notably throughout the Reform in the Walking consultations, feedback raised that our current web presence lacked the agility needed to creatively engage our community and beyond in our mission as the local Church in Melbourne.

Our websites have been running on aging and numerous platforms which have raised a multitude of issues, and limited our ability to provide ongoing support for parishes and agencies. COVID-19 has proven just how integral both physical and online connections are to our mission as Church. Today, we are very pleased to formally present: www.melbournecatholic.org

This project has been an opportunity for us—together—to create a new and more intentional digital footprint into the future.

Functionalities still come in early 2021 will include: a map for searching nearby parishes (e.g. show me all parishes within 10km of my suburb); and a password-protected area for CAM and parish staff.

A website should always be a living thing, open to growth and change, and should reflect the current reality that we are in. We now encourage you to take your time to explore www.melbournecatholic.org. This is the first step in a long-term project and there will still be aspects that need to be migrated and added, but as you work your way through hopefully you will see a proactive and positive approach to promoting the 'good works' of our people of God and the Church that they embody –you will see innovation and creativity – you will find an invitation to encounter the Risen Lord and inspiration to be a witness to that News – and you will feel part of a community. 
