# Fourth Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday) Year B 25th of April 2021

### 1st Reading: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

Psalm: Ps 117:1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28-29 R.

R: The stone rejected by the builders has become the corner stone.

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in men: it is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in princes. **R**

### 2nd Reading: A reading from the first letter of St John 3:1-2

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

### **Gospel Acclamation:**

### Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. **Alleluia!** 

### Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 10:11-18

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

## Good Shepherd Sunday



### Reflection on today's readings

The fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Every year the gospel reading is taken from one part or another of Jesus' discourse on this theme in the tenth chapter of John. Lest we rob the image of its power by contenting ourselves with sentimental representations, the opening prayer of the Mass reminds us of what is at

stake. It speaks of the "brave Shepherd (who) has gone before". For all of its romantic appeal, naming Jesus as our good shepherd implicates us in his unconditional self-sacrifice. It was the courage with which he entered the dark mystery of death that enabled him to break through to the realm of life for us. At the very heart of the Easter season we retrace the path of love that led Jesus to the cross and beyond. This is the path we are challenged to take, fired with the Spirit to live the paschal mystery in the freedom that is ours as the children of God.

### The Story

In today's gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that he is like a good shepherd who cares for his sheep. The good shepherd does not run away when trouble comes, but protects the sheep, even giving his life for them. The sheep know the good shepherd and they follow his voice. In the story, we are the sheep and Jesus is the good shepherd.

### **Family Discussion**

Wolves were a dangerous threat to sheep in Jesus' time – and they still are in some places today. What are some things that threaten to harm us or cause us to feel afraid?

### Something to Think About

Shepherds looks after their sheep and keep them safe from danger. Who protects you and makes you feel safe?

### Dear Jesus,

You are the Good Shepherd. Thank you for caring for us. Be with us when we are afraid and help us to follow your voice.

**Activity** Jesus the Good Shepherd looks after his sheep. You will need for each child: paper plate, templates, cotton balls, glue and scissors. 1. Print the template on card stock. (See below.) 2. Colour and cut out the face and legs of the sheep. 3. Cover the paper plate with cotton balls. 4. Glue the head onto the paper plate. 5. Finally glue the legs onto the paper plate. Make sure the back legs are slightly higher than the ones in front.
